SVOS January Meeting Minutes

Dr. Don Garling (now the Head of Judging for the Great Lakes Region) gave a presentation entitled "Home Remedies, Magic Potions, and Other Methods for Controlling Pests". Don discussed four basic types of pests and diseases: viruses, bacteria, fungi, and parasites. The management of pests and diseases is two pronged: prevention and treatment. Prevention is sequestering new plants for two months and quarantining diseased or infected plants for as long as it takes. Treatment includes physical barriers, chemical means, and biologic methods. Keys to treating a diseased plant include knowing your orchid, the disease or pest, your water (especially pH), the treatment, and the prognosis.

- Home remedies for bacteria or fungus:
fresh hydrogen peroxide (H2O2)
cinnamon
cloves
apply these directly to diseased
area(s)

bleach 10% (to soak tools and pots for 24 hours)

recipe: 1 tsp (for thin-leafed plants) to 1 tbsp (for thick-leafed plants), 1 tsp rubbing alcohol, and 1 tsp liquid baby soap (fragrance-free) in 1 quart of water; spray every 3 days for two weeks
