- Sam Tsui spoke about The Wonderful World of Cochlopetalums (sequential bloomers). Most paphs come from eastern Asia (Indonesia): Sumatra, Java. Cochlopetalums can have up to 30 flowers, up to 4 flowers opening at a time, last up to 6 weeks, can bloom themselves to death. Some species date back to 1892. The culture of these plants is relatively constant temperature, although depending on the elevation, they may be warmer or cooler growers. For longer petals, move the plant in spike to lower light, lower temperature, and higher humidity.

A very big thanks to Amy and Gregg Motter for their help to set up. It went fast and we had a good time doing it. They also did a silent auction and book sale.
