He mainly specializes in Paphiopedilum and Phragmipedium.



Before that I worked at my parents gas station/grocery store in St. Helen when I was 7 years old until I left in 1963.

I was active in the Boy Scouts of America, first in St. Helen and then in Roscommon. I stayed active in the BSA for 35 Years. I was a local/national leader in the Order of the Arrow And was on the National Jamboree staff from 1964 to 1989. I loved to camp and do any thing in the woods.
