Member profiled Edith Sommers



My interest in orchids started with my sister around 2004. She had a couple of them and knew Denise Nash (Ann Arbor Orchid Society). My sister and I visited Denise's greenhouse with beautiful flowering orchids. I had one or two at the time and heard the comment "once you start . . . you're hooked". I now have over 100. I don't have a greenhouse, they are scattered throughout my house. With the brightest light (south windows) in my bedroom where my Cattleyas and psychopsis reside. I have mostly phals but like trying to grow different kinds. I joined SVOS in 2005. My first Thanksgiving Show which was in Midland at Northwood Institute. I purchased some supplies & small plants. The meetings at that time were held in the Community Park Building on Midland Rd. in Freeland. One of my first meetings was just after I had my hip surgery and I hobbled in on a cane with my mom (I couldn't drive yet). Edith Geisler gave a talk (cattleya in her hair behind her ear). I don't remember what her topic was but my mom & I were impressed. Around that time Fred Case was at a May meeting invited the members to his "open house" the next which was mother's day weekend. We were free to roam the grounds and get a look at his greenhouse, ponds and yard where trillium would be in bloom. SVOS meetings had raffles and I would buy \$20 worth coming home with several "new" orchids. From there my collection grew. The spring "newbie" workshop was held at Paul and Roberta Bouleau's house for several years. He and Roberta did a wonderful job of hosting with "gift bags" of supplies and Roberta's delicious lunch. They were along the line of what we do today with members speaking on topics of their expertise and repotting a Phal. to

take home. I took over the treasurer position from Roberta Bouleau in 2011. Before that I was a trustee for a couple years.
