Meeting Minutes from January 14, 2023

New Business:

Upcoming 2023 Orchid Shows

Tim discussed the 2023 Orchid Shows for:
Grand Valley Orchid Society on January 28-29
Greater Lansing Orchid Society on February 25-26
Ann Arbor Orchid Society on March 18-19
Michigan Orchid Society on April 1-2.

He also gave an overview on how SVOS participates in fellow orchid society shows. He explained how the plants are delivered, labeled, transported, arranged, registered, judged and picked up from the show.

It was decided that SVOS would not have a display at the Grand Valley Orchid Show.

Joyce Potoff will be in charge of the Greater Lansing Orchid Show.

Tim Hueston will be in charge of the Ann Arbor Orchid Show.

The person in charge of the Michigan Orchid Society Show has not yet been determined.

Rules and Bylaws of the SVOS - Proposed Change for Article II: Board of Directors

On November 12, 2022, Tim Hueston sent an email to our members asking us to vote on reducing the number of Directors from 6 to 3. He did not receive enough returned emails to constitute a quorum.

The proposal was then discussed at the January 14, 2023, membership meeting. Carol Jurek made a motion to reducing the number of Directors from 6 to 3 and Wendy Bellinger seconded the motion. A vote was taken and all members present were in favor of the proposal and the motion was adopted.

2023 SVOS Orchid Show

Tim explained that three things need to happen for us to have an orchid show in 2023.

- 1) We need to have a venue.
- 2) We need to have Orchid Judges.
- 3) We need to have Orchid Vendors.

1) We need to secure a venue for 3 possibly 4 days. On Thursday afternoon, our Society would set up dividers, curtains, tables, etc . Friday is when all orchid societies set up their displays. Saturday morning is when the orchids will be judged. After the judging is completed, the show is opened to the public. On Sunday the show is open to the public until the show closes; then the displays are

removed and dividers, curtains, tables, etc. are returned to storage.

A number of venues were discussed and we will try to secure one.

2) The Judging Staff is available in November/early December.

3) The orchid vendors cannot commit to our orchid show until we have a venue and a firm date.

A suggestion was also made to charge a small admission fee for our show.

Orchid Education Opportunities

At our meeting, we had a brainstorming conversation on ways to promote our society and the love and care of orchids. Some options talked about were:

a class at Saginaw Valley University through their Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI)

a mini demonstration and display at a local nursery and garden center or at a quilt shop

open one of our membership meetings to the public in conjunction with a presentation by a local external speaker

have a class on how to repotting orchids

Starting Time for Membership Meetings

We had a discussion regarding the starting time for future membership meetings.

One suggestion was a Seasonal Starting time. The membership meetings in the warmer and longer daylight months of May and September could start in the evening at 6:00p.m. or 7:00p.m. and the membership meetings in the colder and shorter daylight months of November, January and March could start in the afternoon at 12:00p.m., 1:00p.m., 2:00p.m. or 3:00p.m.

Another suggestion was keeping the starting time the same for all membership meetings, e.g., 12:00p.m., 1:00p.m., 2:00p.m., 3:00p.m., 6:00p.m. or 7:00p.m.

A survey will be emailed to our membership to ask them what starting time they prefer. Please watch for this email and send Janine Taylor your preference(s).

Orchid Pests and Diseases and Solutions

Tim Hueston gave an informative presentation on orchid pests and diseases along with some valuable solutions.

Two very common pests are scale and mealy bugs. You may also encounter thrips, spider mites, aphids, snails, slugs and white fly too. To control pests, he explained how to use 70% Rubbing Alcohol, Neem Oil, Formula 409, soapy water, Malathion and hand picking them off the plant.

Orchids can become infected with bacterial and fungal diseases, viruses and molds. Diseases are harder to cure. Some disease treatments include cinnamon, fungicides, cutting the infected area to good tissue then treat, and isolation of the plant.

It's better to prevent diseases than treat diseases. Some tips are:

keep your area clean, look at your plants regularly for the first sign of disease, sterilize your tools, use a 10% bleach solution to sterilize certain items (e.g., plastic pots), Tim explained how to sterilize clay pots, you can sterilize scissors with a flame and can spray some items with alcohol to sterilize them.
